





Next was the financial report presented by Treasurer Mary Z. Report was filed for audit.

Committee Reports:

Spring Retreat. Pres. Jackie H again reviewed the possibility of having our retreat in Whitewood. She also volunteered to head this committee. Diane and Sally also volunteered to help. Motel rates are about \$55 a night. More details to come!


Hot schools don't even register on the scale of suffering that our memory box families are experiencing. Their hearts are broken, their moods are
